Results of our mini-congregational meeting on 3/29/26

Per Board President Michael Johnson: “All of those present and all of those who voted electronically or by electronic proxy approved the bylaw change to remove the obligation for an audit. The unanimous approval satisfies the requirement that bylaws must receive a two-thirds majority of those present at a congregation meeting to be changed. All those who voted approved the policy requiring members, when volunteering, to sign a waiver indemnifying the fellowship should they be harmed.”

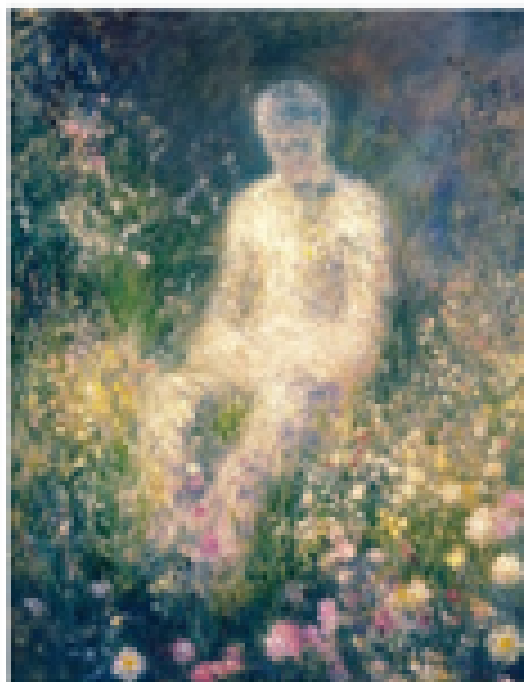

Our May & June read will be a classic: *East of Eden* by John Steinbeck. We'll read this one over two months.

From Amazon: In his journal, Nobel Prize winner John Steinbeck called *East of Eden* "the first book," and indeed it has the primordial power and simplicity of myth. Set in the rich farmland of California's Salinas Valley, this sprawling and often brutal novel

follows the intertwined destinies of two families—the Trasks and the Hamiltons—whose generations helplessly reenact the fall of Adam and Eve and the poisonous rivalry of Cain and Abel.

The masterpiece of Steinbeck's later years, *East of Eden* is a work in which Steinbeck created his most mesmerizing characters and explored his most enduring themes: the mystery of identity, the inexplicability of love, and the murderous consequences of love's absence.
